



How to Play

- **Players:** 3 or more children.
- **Props:** a "Treasure Box" (a simple decorated shoebox), and various "Acts of Kindness" cards.

Rules

1. **The Singing Leader:** A child acts as the "**Rainbow Parrot.**" Who hides the "Treasure Box" somewhere in the play-ground.
2. **The Song Connection:** Other children start searching when they sing a song/bhajan together. As they sing, the "Parrot" chirps or sings along.
3. **The Kindness Tasks:** Hidden near the location of the Treasure Box are several **Kindness Cards**. To "unlock" the box, the children must complete the task on each card they find:
 - "Give a compliment to a friend."
 - "Help clean up a space."
 - "Share a pretend snack with someone."
 - "Fold your hands and say a kind greeting."
4. **The Parrot's Reward:** Once all tasks are completed, the Parrot reveals the Treasure Box which is filled with "**Joy Notes**"—small slips of paper that suggest a fun group activity (e.g., "Give everyone a high-five," "Do a happy dance," or "Tell one thing you love about our group").
5. **The Grand Finale:** Once all the Joy Notes are read and done, the group sits in a circle, holds hands, and finishes with a final "Sairam, Welcome!" to officially "open their shop" of happiness.
