



Materials Needed:

- Small paper box or baskets or bowls (for “harvest”)
- Paper cutouts of flowers, fruits, and vegetables
- A watering can prop (or paper one)
- Space in the classroom or playground

How to Play:

1. **Divide Children into two Teams:** Each team represents a “garden.”
2. **Relay Tasks:**
 - Child 1 runs to “water” the garden (pretend watering).
 - Child 2 pulls out “weeds” (remove paper weeds).
 - Child 3 plants a flower or vegetable cutout in the basket.
 - Child 4 harvests the fruit/vegetable and brings it back.
3. **Funny Twist:** Add “Garden Visitors” like a butterfly (a child flaps arms), a squirrel (pretends to nibble), or a bee (buzzes around). They can playfully distract the team, but the team must stay calm and keep working together.
4. **Winning:** Every team that completes the relay with laughter and teamwork “grows” a beautiful garden.

Reflection: After the game, gather the children and ask to share their experience.
